The first Apple Day was held in Saint John, N.B. on January 30, 1932. Despite the rain and sleet storm, 21,000 apples were handed out. Since that time, Apple Day has become one of Scouts Canada’s most recognizable fall activities.

LEADER NAMES

Have you ever wondered where your leaders got their names?



The names are of characters in the *Jungle Book*, by Rudyard Kipling (1894). It's the story of Mowgli, a young boy who is raised by animal friends in the jungle, and the basis for the Wolf Cub program.

Akela – Head of the Wolf Pack that raises Mowgli. (Hindi for “Old Wolf”)

Bagheera – Black Panther who helps Mowgli through the dangers of the Indian Jungle. (Hindi for “Leopard”)

Baloo – Grey Sloth Bear who also helps Mowgli. (Hindi for “Bear”)

Chil – A Kite Bird that helps rescue Mowgli from the Bander-log, a group of monkeys.

Hathi – Leader of the Elephant Troop. He is one of the oldest animals of the jungle and represents order, dignity and obedience. (Hindi for “Elephant”)

Mang – Bat who talks with Mowgli as he learns the Laws of the Jungle.

Rikki-Tikki-Tavi – Mongoose who protects a young boy from the snake Nag.
