Dear Parents;



Your Cub will depart from Ottawa with their parents on Friday April 27, 2007 for arrival between 6:30 and 7:00 pm, and should be picked up at 11:00 am on Sunday April 29, 2007. We will be staying in an indoor facility with heat.

This weekend will be the link camp - White Tail Beavers (referred to as Tenderpads after the advancement ceremony) will also be attending.

In keeping with the Aboriginal Awareness theme, Cubs will learn some Aboriginal ways through song, games and crafts. There will also be an opportunity for archery skills to be practised and Aboriginal food to be prepared and sampled.

The kitchen is stocked therefore your child will not require dishes or eating utensils. A large portion of our activities will take place outdoors therefore it is **VERY IMPORTANT** your child arrive at camp with the appropriate items packed.

Indoor bedding is required. The difference between a proper sleeping bag and your child's enjoyment at camp comes hand in hand, especially on those damp cool nights. Depending on the weather conditions, the Third Year Cubs may be sleeping outdoors in tents. The decision will be announced on the Tuesday prior to camp to ensure that the proper equipment is brought to camp.



A packing list, Parental Consent form and a map to the camp is attached for your reference. The consent form along with a cheque must be returned to your Akela by the registration date below to allow us to purchase food and finalize the activities.

Please note on the registration form if you would like to attend camp with your child and make a separate cheque for you and your child. We will advise you of the availability prior to the camp date.

IMPORTANT CAMP RULES

Medications

Should your Cub require medication during the camp, his/her medicine must be sent in the original labelled bottle, whether it is a prescription drug or not. Written dosage instructions are also required. This is mandatory and no exceptions can be made. This is for the protection of your child in the event of a medical emergency.



Also, your Cub must be able to take the medicine on his/her own. Leaders can bring the correct dosage to them at the correct times, but we are not allowed to administer medications.

Outside Food

Absolutely NO FOOD or DRINKS of any kind can be brought to camp by Cubs, Parent Volunteers or Leaders. Food that is stored in tents attracts wild animals, which can be very dangerous. Also, there are members of our Pack with food allergies. We plan our camp menu fully considering these allergies and do not want to risk “contaminating” our camp and putting those people with allergies at serious risk of harm or death.



Should your Cub have special dietary needs, please inform your Akela prior to arriving at Camp.

Sign In/Emergency Contact

Upon arrival at camp, you must find your Akela and sign-in your Cub. At that time, you will need to leave an emergency contact number. The contact number must be of someone who is available to answer the phone and potentially pick up your Cub at any time during the entire camp.
